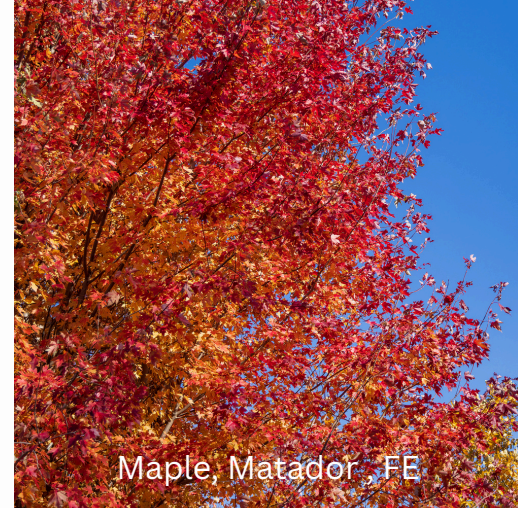
What is our goal with our tree sale? By offering trees and shrubs to the public at a low price, PCCB hopes to increase the beauty and health of our county today and “for those who follow.”

Trees will come in towards the end of April and we will give you a call when they arrive and schedule a pick-up time. You can view the different species, sizes, prices, and availability [HERE](#).

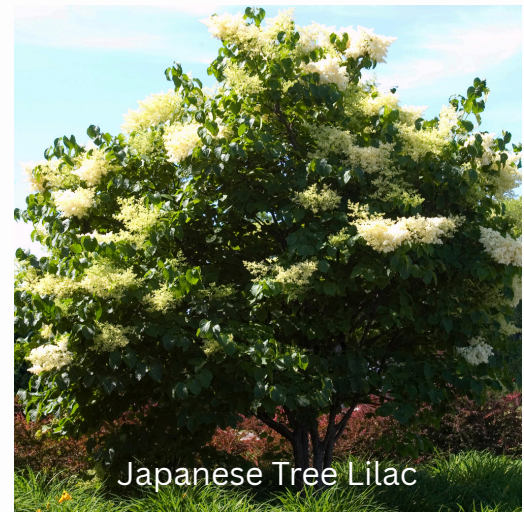

A Step Back In Time... Rosenberger Park

Rosenberger Park has a long history in Pocahontas County.

Originally called Central Park and sat next to the shop and headquarters for the Pocahontas County Conservation Board. The park was officially renamed to Rosenberger Park in 1977 after the first director of the Pocahontas County Conservation Board; Elmer Rosenberger, AKA Mr. Conservation.

Mr. Rosenberger was one of the main drivers for the creation of the Pocahontas Conservation in the early 1960s. Because of his work along side the other early board members the Pocahontas County Conservation now proudly manages 38 parks, campgrounds, wildlife areas, historic sites, and trails encompassing 2,275 acres across the county.

These days Rosenberger Park is a popular place for outdoor enthusiasts of all ages. From class reunions to birthday parties to summer camps this is a place for everyone to enjoy. There is a shelter house that offers seating and rental opportunities for small parties, playground equipment, picnic tables and benches, a restroom and even a fire pit that is perfect for summer and fall evenings.

The PCCB is starting out 2026 with a new and fresh logo. Special thank you to Pilot Rock Signs for helping us refresh our previous logo!

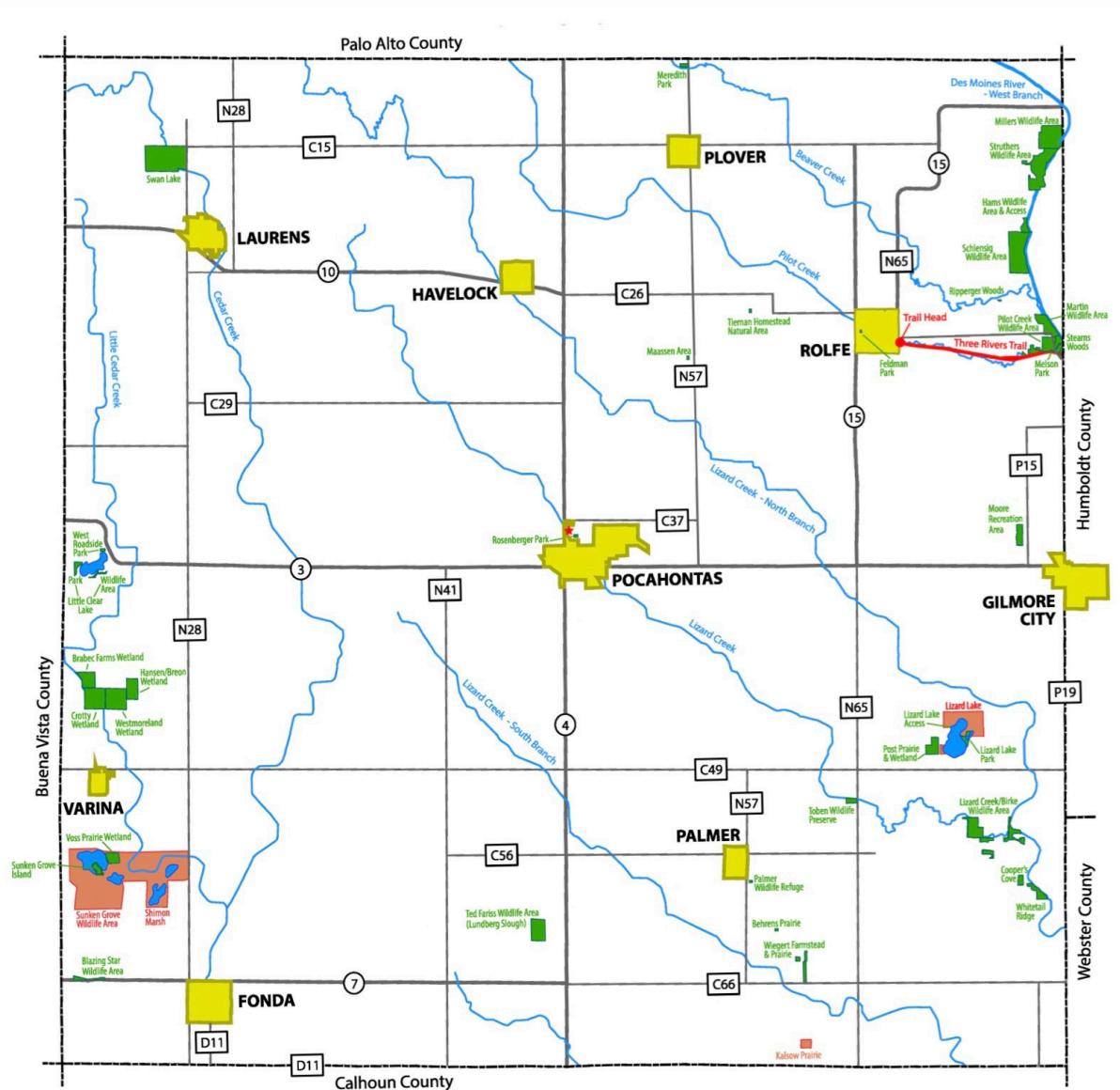
