The Board of Supervisors of Pocahontas County, Iowa, met for a regular session pursuant to adjournment. Members present: Chairman, Kyle Smith; Supervisors, Jeff Ives, Louis Stauter, Clarence Siepker, Brent Aden; and Deputy Auditor, Laura Erickson. Others present: Reporter, Erin Sommers.

Motion by Stauter, seconded by Aden, to approve the minutes from May 28, 2024 as presented. Ayes all, motion carried.

Motion by Siepker, seconded by Ives, to approve the agenda as posted. Ayes all, motion carried.

At 10:15 a.m., the Board had a conference call with Palo Alto County to set the 2024 drainage levy for Jt. DD 63. The full minutes are available for review in the Auditor's office.

Jill Conlin, Public Health Director advised that Public Health has decided to go a different direction with Environmental Health. They would like to terminate the 28E Agreement between Pocahontas County and Humboldt County Environmental Health, effective June 30, 2024 and enter into a 28E Agreement with Calhoun County Environmental Health beginning July 1, 2024. Motion by Aden, seconded by Siepker, to approve the termination of the 28E Agreement between Pocahontas County and Humboldt County Environmental Health, effective June 30, 2024 and authorize the Chairman to sign a 28E Agreement between Pocahontas County and Calhoun County Environmental Health, effective July 1, 2024. Ayes all, motion carried.

Motion by Aden, seconded by Siepker, to approve the Recorder's Report of Fees Collected for the month of May. Ayes all, motion carried.

Motion by Stauter, seconded by Ives, to approve a pay increase for Christina Poncin, FT Jailer/Dispatcher, as she has reached 6-months of employment in the Sheriff's Department. Ayes all, motion carried. On June 11, 2024, Poncin's rate of pay will change to \$19.97/hr., as per union contract.

Motion by Ives, seconded by Aden, to increase monthly pay to Zoning Director, Russ Jergens to \$1,000.00. Ayes all, motion carried.

Motion by Stauter, seconded by Aden, to approve two proposed drainage repairs for Jt. DD 37-35. Ayes all, motion carried. WHEREAS the Board of Supervisors of Pocahontas County, Iowa, acting as Drainage Trustees, having investigated the financial condition of Drainage Districts in Pocahontas County, and having found from said investigation that the funds on hand and available are insufficient to meet the requirements of said Districts, and

WHEREAS in the judgment of said Board of Supervisors, an assessment of a percentage of the latest classification schedule for said Districts is necessary to meet the requirements of said Districts, and to pay off outstanding warrants with accrued interest, heretofore issued against said Districts.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that an assessment of a percentage of the latest classification schedule for said Districts heretofore levied in said Districts be, and the same is hereby levied against all lands, tracts, real estate, highways, and railroads in said Districts, said levy to be set as of June 11, 2024 with the assessment to be due and payable by September 30, 2024 without interest. Assessments not paid by October 1, 2024 will become delinquent and will accrue interest for delinquency same as for ordinary taxes. Assessments in the amount less than \$5.00 shall be computed as \$5.00 as provided by law. Parcels over \$500.00 are eligible for waivers on the Drainage Districts noted with waivers.

RESOLUTION TO VACATE A COUNTY ROAD

Resolution No. 2024-06-26

WHEREAS, A public hearing was conducted on June 11th of 2024 following publication and service of notice as required by law on the proposed vacation and closure of a portion of Pocahontas County Secondary Road, described as follows:

That portion of 480th Street beginning 1400' east from the NW section corner of Garfield 16 (300th Avenue), east along the section line between sections 9 and 16 to the NE section corner of Garfield 16 (310th Avenue). This road being located in Garfield Township (T-92N, R-31W).

WHEREAS, Landowners objected to the County retaining a full 66' right of way in the portion of road to be retained. Otherwise, no other objections have been received, either in writing or by persons present.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Pocahontas County Board of Supervisors that the subject section of road be ordered vacated and closed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the right of way be reduced from 66' to 26' in that 1400' portion of road to be retained, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the existing road berm be obliterated and levelled, and trees in the current right of way be removed as part of the vacation process. The intersection on the east end will be converted to a "T" intersection.
