Supervisors Room, Courthouse Pocahontas, Iowa November 25, 2025

The Board of Supervisors of Pocahontas County, Iowa, met for a regular session pursuant to adjournment. Members present: Chairman, Clarence Siepker; Supervisors, Peter Seehusen, Louis Stauter, Kyle Smith, Brent Aden; Nita Hinrickson, Auditor. Others present: Erin Sommers, Reporter; Russ Jergens, EMA Director; Gary Atherton, Assist. to Engineer/Drainage Clerk; Tate Schmeling, Engineer; Stacia Timmer, Elderbridge CEO; Jon Rosengren & Don Etler, Bolten & Menk.

Motion by Stauter, seconded by Aden to approve the minutes from November 18, 2025 as presented. Ayes all, motion carried.

Motion by Smith, seconded by Stauter to approve the agenda as posted. Ayes all, motion carried.

Russ Jergens advised they have received the final draft of the Comprehensive Plan from MIDAS. Jergens will be setting up a meeting in December with the Planning and Zoning Board to review plan and ordinances.

Gary Atherton, Assist. to Engineer/Drainage Clerk received a letter from IDALS on DD65 regarding status review. There are trees that need to be removed and Atherton will reach out to Conservation for removal.

Atherton advised that regarding DD 6 Invoice from Schoon Excavating in the amount of \$432.37. That amount will be deducted from the total of Work Order 2844.

Tate Schmeling, Engineer had to formally remove .25 miles from farm to market roads with the removal of the Bradgate bridge. Motion by Aden, seconded by Smith to approve Resolution 2025-11-#43 Bradgate Bridge Removal Farm to Market. Roll call vote: Ayes: Seehusen, Stauter, Siepker, Smith, Aden. Nays: none. Motion carried. Full resolution can be requested at the auditor's office.

Schmeling asked to change inspector pay from onsite to year-round. Motion by Aden, seconded by Seehusen to approve inspector pay increase \$.25/hour for the inspector effective December 1, 2025. Ayes all, motion carried.

Schmeling also advised that they should be receiving a new dump truck in the next few weeks and in the meantime will be taking an old dump truck to the auction. The Fonda bridge is almost all removed. The last pipe culvert has been completed and next week they are looking at purchasing a different hoist.

Stacia Timmer, Elderbridge CEO highlighted what Elderbridge has done for the county. They received \$7,302 for FY 2026 and is asking for \$7,633 for FY 2027.

Jon Rosengren & Don Etler, Bolten & Menk discussed with the board on moving forward with the wetland locator project for Pocahontas County. Don Etler has been hired as the Project Coordinator. IDALS now has the funding already in place. IDALS also wants to use solar pumps instead of gravity and they will maintain the pumps. They are looking for 40 sites in Pocahontas County. Motion by Stauter, seconded by Smith to appoint Jon Rosengren as engineer to find the sites for Pocahontas County. Ayes all, motion carried.

Nita Hinrickson, Auditor advised that they had received a thank you from Family Crisis Centers. Derek Essing is working on getting sewer pipe relining quotes. Aden and Siepker will be runners for the December 9, 2025 Special Election.

Motion by Stauter, seconded by Aden to only have the supervisors meeting on Friday, January 2, 2026 instead of two that week. Ayes all, motion carried.

Peter Seehusen discussed with the board on raising beavertails from \$40 a tail to \$50 a tail. The board decided to leave as is
