4/14/2021

Moderna:

Prime (1st) doses administered: 1480 (1600 received plus another 100 allocated 4/14)

Boost (2nd) doses administered: 1200 (1300 received plus another 100 allocated 4/12)

Johnson & Johnson:

200 doses allocated on 3/31 to use at Bobalee, Inc. and for special or at-risk populations

30 doses used at Bobalee on April 9th

170 remaining

UPCOMING VACCINATION SCHEDULE – (CLINICS ARE BY APPOINTMENT ONLY!)

April 16th

100 2nd doses from 3/19 10 – noon in the Assembly Room

200 1st doses from 2 – 5pm in the Assembly Room (100 Moderna & 100 J&J)

April 23rd

100 2nd doses from 3/26 10 – noon at the Expo Center plus Pengo and HorseTech

100 1st doses from 2 – 5pm at the Expo Center

April 26th – Fisher Hydraulics 2nd doses

April 28th – Positech and BrandFX 2nd doses

May 7th - 100 2nd doses at Bobalee, Jack Links, Laurens City Hall and office from 2-4pm

May 14th - 100 2nd doses from 4/16 10am – noon in the Assembly Room

May 21st – 100 2nd doses from 4/23 10am – noon in the Assembly Room

On April 13th, IDPH announced that the CDC was recommending a pause in using the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. The ACIP is meeting in the afternoon on April 14th and we will decide in the morning on Thursday, April 15th what happens to the 100 doses of J&J we have scheduled for Friday, April 16th based on the recommendations from that meeting.

We are taking names and scheduling appointments for any individual that is 18 years of age and other that would like to receive the vaccine. Our final large vaccination clinic for prime (1st doses) will be April 23rd. If there continues to be demand for the vaccine, we will schedule in groups of 10 for the Moderna vaccine at our office. The Moderna vaccine is a 10-dose vial that must be used within six hours after its punctured.
